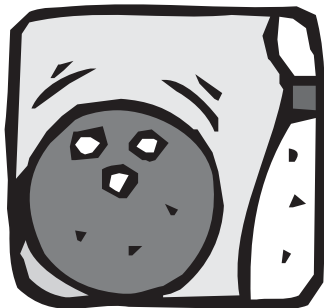

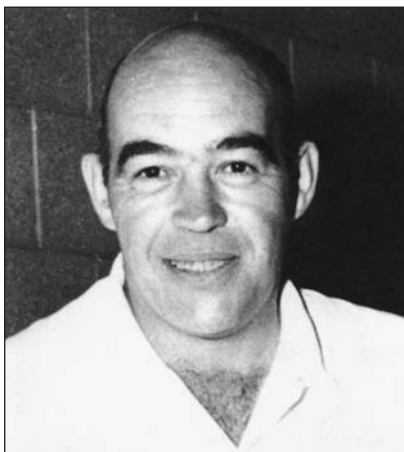

Washington State USBC is sponsoring its second Jamboree on Friday, October 5th through Sunday, October 7th in Wenatchee. This activity-filled weekend has something for everyone:

Registration fee for the Jamboree is \$35.00 and includes educational materials for workshops, Saturday lunch and Sunday breakfast. The coaching class will be \$60 for pre-registration, \$65 on site. The Washington State Youth Leaders will be in charge of the fun tournament and the cost is \$10.

The third annual Youth Masters Tournament sponsored by the Washington State USBC Youth Committee will be held on Saturday, October 20th and Sunday, October 21st at Bowlero Lanes in Tacoma.

This is a scratch tournament with 5 divisions, designed to give youth bowlers of all abilities the opportunity to participate in a "scratch" tournament. Entries are limited to the first 96 entries and the entry fee will be \$45.00 for pre-registration until October 12th. After that date, the entry fee will be \$65.00.

Youth are encouraged to sign up for this event which will feature a "sport compliant" condition and award scholarships to all finalists. Entry forms are available at www.wsusbc.net and www.wsusbc.com and online payment is offered.

Our higher average bowlers will also have an opportunity to register for a Junior Gold Premiere Event during this tournament. Bowlers must meet the average requirements and be a member of Junior Gold in order to compete. Winners of this tournament will have a paid entry into the 2008 National Junior Gold Tournament in Detroit and reimbursement for travel up to \$500.

This list represents more than a lifetime of memories. Most of these centers were built in the post-automatic pinsetter boom of the late 1950's and early 1960's. Sun Villa Lanes in Eastgate was built in the late sixties; Sportsworld in the late seventies, Acme Bowl opened in 2005, joining The Garage in the "recreational bowling" business (Acme now does host sanctioned leagues), a new "rec only" venue operated by the Lucky Strike Entertainment is scheduled to open in Bellevue later this year.

The list of reasons for bowling centers closing is nearly as long as the list of centers itself, at the top of the list is overbuilding in the early sixties, centers becoming "functionally obsolete" in the seventies and eighties, and rising land values since the early 1990's.

What once was close to sixty is now less than twenty. Based on my forty plus years around the bowling business, and twenty years in the real estate business, I think more centers will be on their way out. Land is just too valuable in the metro areas for a stand alone center to pencil out.

I think the trend of "nightclub" style will do well in certain affluent urban areas, but it will do little if anything to promote bowling as a sport or a family activity.

We need new centers, modern, clean, well staffed, family oriented. I think it will happen, although not in the traditional "stand alone" sense, but as part of a multi-use retail or multi-story complex (with paid parking), this is the case in Europe and Asia.

I also feel that for the sport of bowling to grow, the owners (BPAA), the governing body (USBC), and the competitive end (PBA) must work together. More about that in the next issue.

The second day found Anthony Escalona of A Pale Between Two Ambers dominating the action with Sherrie Butler leading the way for the women.

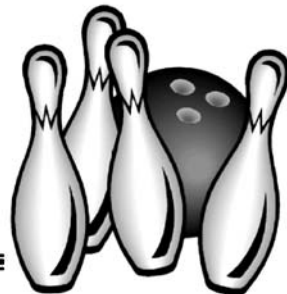

An Interview With Jason Williams

I sat down and talked with the multi-faceted **Jason Williams** the other night. His accomplishments are too numerous to list in this story, but here are a just a few of the major ones:

He was on the Collegiate Championship Wichita State team in 1998.

He was the leading money winner in bowling in the world in 2001, winning nearly a quarter of a million dollars.

He won the High Roller for \$100,00. And, he came in second in another for \$50,000.

He came in third in the ABC Masters in 2004 losing to Walter Ray Williams.

He also has

- 4 PBA Regional titles
- 10 OBA titles
- 4 WCT titles
- 2 Leilani Swiss title

With all that, I wanted to know what his future plans were, and get his opinions on the state of bowling.

STE: What do you think of the PBA?

JW: I think with the oil patterns that the PBA is using they are trying to make bowling like golf. In golf, you can see the sand trap, the trees. They're trying to show the viewing audience how difficult it is to bowl on the patterns. The viewing audience basically doesn't get it. The patterns seem like a good idea, but they're not bowling. I say oil the lanes, don't re-oil the rest of the day, and let the bowlers adjust to the break-down. The best bowlers will rise to the top. Norm Duke and Brian Voss would dominate.

STE: What other changes would you like to see made?

JW: Bowling has always been a blue collar sport and that is never going to change, so I would like to see the PBA appeal to that group by letting the bowlers be themselves. Let Parker Bohn trash talk Patrick Allen. If they cuss or kick the ball return, fine them, but let them do it, it would bring interest to the game. Look at what McEnroe did for tennis.

STE: What are your future plans?

JW: I am going to bowl around here for the next couple of years' probably hit some of the major tournaments like the U.S. Open, then when my daughter gets a little older I am going to go travelling again. From 1998 to 2004 I bowled in Europe quite a bit. They have tournaments over there that pay \$10,000 for first place and I was pretty successful over there. But when my daughter gets to the age she wants to bowl, I want to be back here for that. I definitely want to coach her.

STE: Do you like to coach?

JW: Yes, I would like to coach, but I'm really selective about who I coach. Back east, bowlers go to the bowling center and practice for six and seven hours and I would like to coach someone with that kind of dedication. I just don't see that kind of dedication in this area.

STE: You don't think there is much young talent coming up?

JW: A lot of younger players think that bowling balls are the key to bowling good. The more equipment they get, the better. Bowling has been, and always will be, about fundamentals and technique. Look at Bob Davidson and Mike Karch in this area, and how good they are with their different hand positions. Its not about bowling balls.

STE: Do you think that the easy lane conditions of league bowling lend itself to people not practicing?

JW: Definitely. League bowlers just want to throw 3 games, average 200 and go home. They don't want to work at the game. I grew up on Vashon Island and I bowled at Vashon Bowl where they maybe oiled the lanes twice a week, and stripped once a month. Sometimes I would practice 7 to 8 hours a day. My arm sometimes would feel like it was going to come off.

STE: So where are you bowling league this year?

JW: I'm bowling the Red Hook at Majestic and the Insurance League at Sunset.

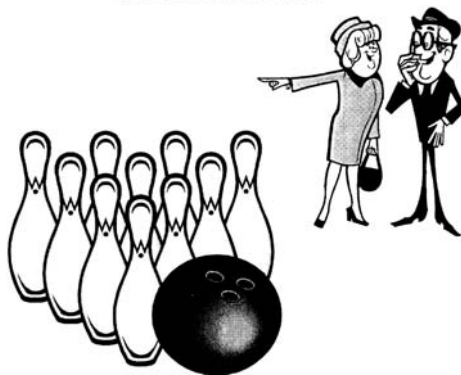
