**B**remerton's **Kristy Whitcher** ended three years of domination by **Heidi Pierce**, defeating **Makayla Douglas** 270-226 in the championship of the 2012 Seattle Queens tournament held at Robin Hood Lanes on January 7-8th.

This was the fourth edition of the Queens, and Whitcher became only the second bowler to win. Pierce won the first three years of the event.

Thirty four bowlers came out Sunday, Jan. 8th to bowl four games of qualifying and then the field was cut in half. Three more games led to an 8 game match play followed by a stepladder final.

## Skrinski Wins Seattle Senior Scorefest at Kent Bowl

The lanes were red hot. The bowlers were red hot. The scores were stratospheric and an extremely red hot **Steve Skrinksi** won the

Greater Seattle USBC Senior Masters at Kent Bowl Dec. 3-4. Skrinksi beat good friend and close rival **Ken Ross** 254-215 in the championship game of the Senior Masters. Steve won \$550 for his great performance.

Wait a minute. High scoring at Kent Bowl? Isn't this the center that has had only a handful of 300 games? New synthetic lanes installed in July provided optimum scoring conditions. Thirty four bowlers bowled an eight game qualifying squad with a score of +282 or a 235 average to make Sunday's match play round.

## Baker Takes GSUSBC Super Senior Masters at Kent Bowl

**R**ay Baker capped off a roller coaster year by winning the Greater Seattle Super Senior Masters defeating **Larry Lindberg** 224-185 in the final match at Kent Bowl Dec. 4th. Baker took home \$350 for his first place efforts.

Thirty one bowlers 60 and over started the afternoon Sunday with scoring being on the high side. It took a score of +145 for 5 games or a 229 average to make the stepladder final.

**Rick Gustin** who ended up 6th bowled a 299 in game 3 but missed the final because his 5th game was a struggling 168. At this point, Larry Lindberg was the leader averaging 239 for the 5 game block. Steve Boesel was only 5 pins back in 2nd.

The stepladder finals became Ray Baker time as the Kent left hander bowled 804 for the first three games of the stepladder. Ray started off shooting a perfect 300 game against Puyallup's **Matt Surina** in game one of the stepladder. Surina took home \$100 for his fifth place finish. Baker then walloped Bernie Smith 258-176 in game two to send Smith home with a \$125 4th place check.

In the only match that was close, Baker defeated Lacey based **Steve Boesel** 246-236. Boesel, who does most of his bowling at Aztec Lanes in Olympia settled for the \$175 third place prize.

In the championship match, the smooth stroke of Larry Lindberg disappeared and Ray Baker cruised to a 39 pin victory over the tall right-handed Daffodil bowler. Lindberg received \$250 for his great performance.

"It was a long time coming", Ray Baker exclaimed about his victory." " I won a bunch of tournaments in the 90s including Bowlers Challenges and Auto Dealers tournaments so its been a long drought until this one."

It really felt good" Baker said.

Baker's roller coaster ride this year began with his being named to the Greater Seattle Senior All Star team but hit a low spot with one of the lowest games ever shot in All Star competition, a 98. However the ride went back to the top with his Super Senior Masters victory. Congratulations, Ray!

**In the 70 year old and over division, a companion tournament to the Super Senior Masters, **Jim Micus** defeated **Wes Puishis** in the final match to annex the \$120 first place prize. Micus had to punch out to defeat Wes 233-223.**

This edition of the Masters drew 65 bowlers, one of the largest Masters field in quite some time. The action started on Saturday, Jan. 7th with an eight game qualifying squad. Most of the bowlers in the 65 player field could muster a good game but usually followed it with a sub-par one as well.

The top twenty four bowlers would come back on Sunday with a cut score of -8, or a 199 average, to make Sunday's action. **Curtis Messer** of Central Park WA was the tournament leader and last years second place finisher **Jodey Rees** was not far behind in second.

Five more games of qualifying on Sunday weeded out the top 8 for match play in the afternoon set. **Hugh Miller** took over the top spot that he would not relinquish for the rest of the tournament. Curtis Messer entered the match play round in second and Dean Richards of Tacoma was third.

The key to this tournament for most of the bowlers was staying consistent and Miller definitely was throughout match play. You could get away with one bad game as most of the bowlers did, but two or three and you probably were not going to make the stepladder finals. **Mike O'Brien** only had one sub 200 game in the match play, so he solidified his second seed and **Jason Williams** nailed down the third spot in the stepladder final.

The eighth game position round was where the fireworks erupted as **Josh Jackson, Jodey Rees, Scott Halvarson** and **Curtis Messer** all had a shot to get the 4th and 5th spot in the stepladder.

Jodey Rees picked up the 5-10 split to secure the 4th spot with a 159 game. Curtis Messer and Scott Halvarson both struggled mightily with Messer winning 164-141, but Halvarson had enough pins on Messer to hang onto the 5th spot. Twenty three year old Josh Jackson almost flew over the top of both players with a 220 but came up seven pins short. I am sure we will be hearing a lot more from this young Bothell cranker.

In the stepladder, Jodey Rees defeated defending champ Scott Halvarson 207-186 in game one sending Scott home with a \$450 5th place check.

Rees then went on to meet Jason Williams. Similar to last years tournament, Jodey blew out his index finger which gave him a lot of trouble during Sunday's action. Last year Rees's thumb looked like hamburger meat. Rees gutted out game two of the stepladder, but Jason Williams was too much for Jodey, winning 244-189. Rees took home \$550 for fourth place.

That set the stage for the semifinal match with the two hottest bowlers in the field going against each other. Mike O'Brien opened up with the first seven strikes against Williams and never looked back, making Jason exit with a 277-216 thrashing. Williams put his balls away for another day and picked up his \$650 third place check.

In the championship match, Miller had the choice of finishing first or last and he was pretty adamant about making O'Brien finish last. "You always want to put pressure on the bowler finishing last" Miller said. "It makes them come through in the clutch or not."

Highlights of the qualifying rounds were **Cheryl Trevethan** coming out of the gate in game one with the first 10 strikes in a row. Trevethan went wide on the 11th ball to finish with a 286. Cheryl didn't have too much success in the games that followed, not making it into the match play round.

Another bowler not having too much success this year was the defending champ, **Heidi Pierce**. Pierce did not survive the first cut.

The only youth bowler in the field, **Makayla Douglas**, led the qualifying with a 217 average.

Douglas is only 16 and bowls out of **Mollala Bowl** in Oregon. Still being in the Youth ranks, Makayla was bowling for scholarship money. A star studded field that included **Cindy Mattingly, Kristi Whitcher, Debbie Bayer** and **Mandy Green** rounded out the top eight.

Looking like she wasn't going to make the championship rounds, Whitcher barely snuck into the stepladder despite a 148 in game 3 of match play. Whitcher played **Mindy Pancoast** in the first game of the stepladder. Pancoast, who bowls in the 900 global league at Hi-Line, couldn't get much going against Whitcher, losing 203-154. Pancoast picked up \$250 for 4th place.

Whitcher then went on to face always tough Cindy Mattingly in game two. Whitcher started to heat up against Mattingly, downing Cindy 248-214. Mattingly nailed down the \$350 third place prize.

In the championship match 54 year old Whitcher faced 16 year old Makayla Douglas for the title. Early on Douglas was staying with Whitcher's strike barrage, but a 10 pin in the 9th frame by Douglas clinched the victory for Kristi. Whitcher spared in the first, struck in the second and spared in the 3rd, then went off the

sheet for 270. Makayla's 226 usually would have been enough to win the title, but Whitcher was just too tough.

"I wanted to show that older bowlers can still do it," Whitcher stated. Kristi won \$600 for her efforts and Makayla put \$450 into her Smart account for college.

An enthusiastic crowd at Robin Hood really propelled the championship stepladder rounds. Whitcher, Douglas, Mattingly and Pancoast put on a great show for the local bowling fans.

## Bowling For Life

**B**owling is one of those sports that you can participate in your entire life, you only have to keep yourself in a moderate state of health and physical condition. It is not aerobically challenging, there is no ideal height or weight required, you can be short or tall, skinny or large, the pins do not care. They only want to be knocked down. If the ball gets too heavy, get a lighter one. A lady in our travel league throws a 10# ball and gets enough strikes to make it fun. You do not have to throw it 20 mph, 10 works just fine.

A friend of mine John Parkin, who does great work overseeing special needs adults bowl at Majestic Lanes recently had a stent installed, he took one week off bowling and was back throwing the ball the following week. As our bowling population ages this is becoming quite common. With the advances in medicine your setback time is minimal, triple bypass heart surgery, no big deal.

There are still quite a few bowlers in their eighties and nineties still cranking it up. Jim Scala from Westbury, New York is the oldest USBC member at 106. He practices two to three times a week and has cut down to one league now. I talked to the league coordinators from two houses in Sun City, Arizona. Bell Lanes has 20 senior leagues (they are all senior leagues), they have 65 bowlers over 80 and 20 over 90. At Lakeview Lanes they have 33 leagues for a total of 2,100 bowlers. The very nice lady there, who used

to bowl at Robin Hood Lanes, estimated 40% were over 80 years young.

Locally we have 12 over age 80 in our senior travel league. At 91 Harold Terpstra is the oldest league bowler that I could locate. Harold bowls a league on Wednesday and bowls the senior no tap on Fridays at Majestic.

He throws a 16# ball by the way. Also Boyd Palmer and Gene Mc Murray, who are both 90, can still crank it up. Vern Peterson and Gene Linstead, in their eighties, are still bowling a scratch league. Gene finished with a 213 avg. last year. Wes Hall at 85 is the elder statesman of the 9 Pin Tour. He bowls the majority of the tournaments. And I still play quite a bit of softball. Our tournament divisions are in increments of five years all the way to over 85. That's a lot of old guys running around, the point being just keep active.

In a recent study by the University of Gothenburg, Sweden they concluded that longevity is greatly enhanced by socialness, being socially active. I do not think there is a more social sport than bowling. You are in a confined area and you bowl a different team every week so there is an opportunity for a lot of social connections. You have teams on both sides to witness your triumphs and misfortunes. The bottom line is keep bowling, live longer. Hopefully there will be a few houses left to go to in our area, or we may have to move to Sun City to knock those pins down.

## Just Throw It Better

By Hugh Miller

This past weekend I bowled a JBT (Junior Bowlers Tour) event at Hi Line Lanes in Seattle WA. It was a doubles and baker team event, so adults got a chance to bowl with the kids, I bowled with my son Quinton, it was well attended (full house) and lots of fun.

The first thing I noticed when I took my equipment to our starting pair (yes, I did bring two double bags, four balls!) was every settee, every chair, every table, and the whole bowlers area was crammed with bowling balls and bowling bags, there was nowhere to sit and very little room to stand, literally there were bowling balls everywhere!

I started to think, when did all this bowling ball craziness start, after all, when I first started bowling seriously in the early 1970's, nobody ever brought more than two bowling balls to a league or tournament competition. There was always plenty of room to sit, even with five on a pair, my routine was to sit



and relax between frames.

I distinctly remember the first time I noticed the locker room on the PBA tour getting over crowded with equipment; it was the 1981 PBA National Championship at Imperial Lanes in Toledo Ohio. The PBA National was a major on the winter tour, open to all PBA members, back then it often sold out.

Imperial was a 60 lane center, the tournament was long format, 3 squads, 120 bowlers per squad. It was at this tournament AMF did the first mass introduction of their new urethane ball, the Angle™. I think their intent was to give at least one ball to every player in the tournament, that's at least 360 balls, or 90 cases of bowling balls. I remember there were cases of new balls stacked everywhere, and the player services truck was drilling balls 24-7 for three straight days!

What I also remember about this event was that I crossed with Earl Anthony in *(Continued on Page 15)*

qualifying. Back then, there were large crowds at PBA tournaments, especially in the evening the center would be packed, and the "superstars", Roth, Holman, and Anthony, had a huge following. Anthony had the biggest crowd of all following him, so if you crossed with him, you had a huge gallery watching you every game!

The first day, Earl uncharacteristically struggled, and I got a few good breaks, I actually beat him the first eight game block. I can't remember all the details, but he left quite a few seven pins, even missed a couple, a few washouts, pocket splits, a chopped spare or two. I wound up about 90 over for the eight games, over a 210 average, good enough to be solidly in the cash and close to the top 24. I think Earl was up about 20-30 over, barely in the cash. He was not too happy with his round. I didn't say anything to him

during the eight games, except maybe "see you tomorrow" when the round was finished and as we signed our scorecards. When I got back to my motel room, I was pretty stoked, as I was in the top 24 after the first round, ahead of Earl, maybe I was on my way to a show in a major!

During the second round, things did not go as well for me, and Earl began striking, the crowd got behind him, cheering louder with each strike. They even let out an occasional groan as I left another split, and gave me some applause when I made the 6-8. I distinctly remember with one game to go in the round, Earl had +327 next to his name, I had lost pins, sitting about 50 over. I may have drilled one of those new AMF angles, I can't remember if I used it. Earl used the same ball as the day before. When we got done, as disappointed as I was about my performance, I was truly amazed at Earl's round (even though I had spent quite a bit of time watching him the past couple of years, it is different when you are bowling with him on the same lanes at the same time, and can't find ANYTHING, while he is averaging 230+). When we finished the block, I mustered up the courage to ask Earl what he did different, as he was besieged by autograph seekers and the reporters covering the tournament, he looked at me, winked and said "Hughie, I just threw it better".

History shows Earl Anthony went on to win the 1981 PBA National Championship, repeated in 1982 and again in 1983. I believe Hugh Miller scratched and fought for a paycheck in all three of those events. So there is a bit of advice from arguably the greatest of all time that still holds true today, 30 years later, in the modern era of changing bowling balls every time you miss the pocket or leave a corner pin. Sometimes, the answer is to "just throw it better!"

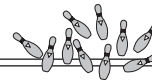

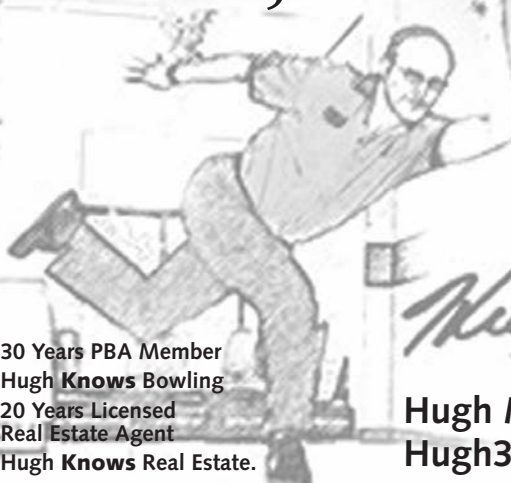
